# Birmingham 2022 Commonwealth Games

Taking place from 28 July to 8 August 2022, the Commonwealth Games will be a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to showcase Birmingham and the West Midlands on a global stage. It will see 72 Commonwealth nations come together for 11 days of sport featuring 6,500 athletes and officials.

There will be an anticipated 1.5 billion global online spectators and with 11 days of swimming and diving, 8 days of cricket, 8 days of gymnastics and 7 days of athletics, including the marathon, the summer of 2022 is set for a spectacular home Games.

This Games will make global sport history by becoming the first ever major multisport event to award more medals to women than men, as well as the largest integrated Para-sport programme.



# **Tickets**

Spectators with a Games ticket can access public transport for journeys which originate and terminate within the ®Network area on the day of their event.

Non-ticketed spectators will have to pay for public transport services and organise tickets themselves.

The ®Network area is highlighted in the West Midlands Public Transport Boundary Map below:



Ticketed spectators can travel within the ®Network boundary, the local area covered by the West Midlands public transport network, including bus, rail, and tram services. Journeys must originate and terminate within the ®Network area and ticket splitting is not permitted.

Spectators should be prepared to show the event ticket on demand to verify entitlement to travel. The event ticket may either be downloaded onto a device, such as a mobile phone or printed as a paper ticket.

There are three Games venues that are located outside the ® Network area. Travel is also covered if you have an event ticket for any of these venues:

- Cannock Chase (3 August) Cross Country and London Northwestern Railway services between Wolverhampton and Stafford (one day only).
- Myton Fields, Warwick (07 August)

   Chiltern Railways and West
   Midlands Railway services between
   Dorridge, Coventry and Warwick, and
   Stagecoach bus services (X17 and X18).
- Victoria Park, Royal Leamington Spa (29 July – 6 August) – West Midlands Railway, Cross Country and Chiltern Railways services between Dorridge, Coventry and Leamington Spa, National Express (service 11) and Stagecoach bus services (X17 and X18).

### **Ticket design**

Tickets are electronic only. This means ticketed spectators will receive an electronic ticket they can either print themselves or download to their digital phone wallet. A ticket is valid for one person, per the designated session.

The digital wallet ticket will be downloadable to either Apple, or Android devices, and the design will differ slightly dependent on whether they are held on an Apple or Android devices.

All tickets will have:

- Date of session
- Time of session
- Venue name
- Session name
- Lead booker name
- Block, row, seat
- Terms and conditions
- Sponsorship description

# How to tell if an event ticket is fraudulent?

- If you are concerned the ticket is fraudulent, ask the customer to log into their ticket account, or to show the email confirmation received from Birmingham 2022.
- Do not accept screenshots.
  A screen shot is not a "live"
  ticket. A live ticket is a ticket
  that should move, and not be
  static. A non-fraudulent ticket
  will move and zoom without
  ruining the font type, logo or
  design of the barcode.
- A non-fraudulent ticket will, always have supporting information, be clear to read, not fuzzy and all information clearly visible.

# Access to public transport with accreditation

From 19 July to 10 August 2022 anyone with a Birmingham 2022 accreditation can travel for Games purposes on public transport services within the ®Network area. Accreditation will permit the holder to access local public transport services.

Anyone travelling outside the 
®Network area should be charged full fare as applicable, other than those accessing the three venues outside of the ®Network area.

#### **Accreditation**

There are two types of accreditation available:

- Version one these are the most common
- Version two

Accreditations are produced to a high standard with very clearly printed photographs and text. They are fully laminated with raised detail on the reverse of the laminate. They also come with several different colour bands and categories, but the layout and security features will always be the same.

# Birmingham 2022 Festival

Running from 17 March until 30 September, the Birmingham 2022 Festival promises to be the biggest celebration of creativity in the region and one of the largest ever Commonwealth Games cultural programmes.

# **Venue** information

The Birmingham 2022 Commonwealth Games has been a catalyst for transformation across the West Midlands region. We have witnessed the construction of and redevelopment of sports venues such as the Alexander Stadium in Perry Barr and the new Sandwell Aquatics Centre in Smethwick.

As the venues being used to host the Games stretch from Coventry and Royal Leamington Spa in the east to Cannock Chase Forest in the northwest of the region, public transport will be instrumental in keeping the region moving and getting spectators to events on time.

# Changes to public transport

Expect many changes to transport services during the Games. To keep the region moving during this busy period, additional transport services will be added to alleviate pressure on the network and provide for extra demand.

There will also be new measures such as City Centre shuttle buses, Park & Ride services and a dedicated accessible bus system to ensure everyone can get to the venues on time.

#### Walk or cycle

If spectators are travelling locally, walking or cycling will be the easiest way to get to the venue. Cycle parking will be available at all venues.

West Midlands Cycle Hire is available across the West Midlands. Bikes are available 24/7, with docking stations at major bus, metro and train stations, visitor attractions and city or town centres.

During the Commonwealth Games, visitors will be able to take advantage of two 30-minute cycle hire rides, free of charge. To make things easier, there will also be pop-up virtual docking stations at the following venues:

- Alexander Stadium

- Edgbaston Stadium (dock in Cannon Hill Park)
- Smithfield
- Sandwell Aquatics Centre

Please be aware that there may be changes to timetables, stops and routes during the Games period.

Spectators are encouraged to use the Games Journey Planner to calculate the best route to get to their venue on time.

Please note, there will be disruption to bus routes and stops throughout the Games. These will be heavily impacted during the Marathon on 30 July and the Cycling Time Trial on 4 August.

#### Park & Ride sites

Spectators will need to pre-book a car parking space for their vehicle at the appropriate Park & Ride site in advance. Due to high demand, we are unable to offer an on-the-day option.

Park & Ride sites will have a short walk to a shuttle bus that will transport spectators from the car park to the venue. Park & Walk sites have a designated walking route that will take spectators directly to the venue. Each site has an estimated journey time.

#### Games shuttle buses

If spectators are travelling to Alexander Stadium, Coventry Stadium and Arena, Cannock Chase Forest, Edgbaston Stadium or Sandwell Aquatics Centre, there are dedicated Games shuttle services from key locations across the region.

These are included in the price of the Birmingham 2022 ticket. Spectators do not need to pre-book.

Shuttles will start running approximately 2 - 3 hours before each event and for approximately 90 minutes after.

#### **Drive**

There are temporary road restrictions and no parking, pick-up or drop off facilities at venues except pre-booked blue badge parking.

Some venues have park and ride facilities where a shuttle bus will drop spectators at the venue, but these must be pre-booked in advance. There are also park and walk sites with designated walking routes to venues, these also must be pre-booked.

For spectators with accessible requirements please use the dedicated Blue Badge booking locations or the rail and accessible shuttle options. All Blue Badge parking is free but has limited availability and must be pre-booked.
